General Comments

On the morning of the monitoring visit, the afterschoolers in the Children's Room were preparing to go play in the Squash Court located inside the building. The majority of the children wanted to play Gaga ball and a few children chose to read. There were, however, a few children who did not bring a novel down with them and there were no other choices made available to these children. With a small table and chairs located close to the court, other materials could be brought down in a tote or backpack to offer different choices. Examples are card games, coloring or books since this group seems to enjoy reading.

The Epsilon Room was having a PJ Day. I observed lunch and I encourage educators to not just supervise while standing but to sit with the children. Behaviors began to escalate, and sitting with the children and showing polite manners and setting a good example could help create a more pleasant meal time.

As noted on the Public Health report from June, the walls require attention. The report indicates that walls must be repaired so they can be easily cleaned and sanitized.

The rooms also require some of the materials to be better organized. It is important to prepare the environment to create an inviting atmosphere for the children to choose different activities.

I only noted positive child guidance during the visit. Educators showed patience and provided lots of nurturing care such as a quiet voice, reassurance and empathy when children needed it.

General Comments

Fire Drills are up to date and have been recorded. Both child and staff files are complete.
