Comments: In 10 child record audited, one does not have the child's Medicare number. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the operator that all child record must include the child's name, birthdate and Medicare number.

Comments: Ir m T ac	In 10 child record audited, seven does not have the name, address and telephone number for the child's medical practitioner. Although it does indicate Monton Clinic, no address or telephone number is provided. The Quality Assurance Monitor mentioned to the operator that all child records must contain the name, address and telephone number of the child's medical practitioners. The Quality Assurance Monitor also mentioned that if the child does not have medical practitioner the parents must indicate being on a waitlist or no medical practitioner.						

General Comments

The Quality Assurance Monitor conducted an on-site monitoring inspection.

The child-to-staff ratio was maintained throughout the visit.

During the inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor verified the following:

- -Information is posted in a visible and prominent place in the facility.
- -Signed consent forms are present in each child's file.
- -Daily activities are documented.
- -Child guidance practices are followed.

While on site, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed children engaged in indoor play, singing, and dancing. The Quality Assurance Monitor also observed the children during lunch.

A discussion took place between the Quality Assurance Monitor and the operator regarding handwashing

procedures. The Quality Assurance Monitor noted that none of the children had washed their hands before eating. The operator explained that the educator present was a substitute for the regular classroom educator. The Quality Assurance Monitor emphasized the importance of all educators being aware of their responsibilities, including handwashing, especially given that a child had recently vomited in the classroom. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the operator that both staff and children should follow proper handwashing procedures, as outlined in the Public Health Inspection Standards (November 2015, Appendix 38) and the Guidelines for the Prevention and Control of Communicable Diseases in Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) Facilities, Appendix 39.
