Comments: Departure times were missing on attendance records within 2 out of the 3 groups. These incomplete records resulted in children being unaccounted for within the indoor environment for approximately 10 minutes. These records must be completed each time a child arrives and leaves and are to be accurate and reflect all children present at any given time. Documents containing children's first and last names were noted within the entrance and being stored in transparent totes outside the office, allowing for confidential information to be accessible to parents/visitors. Attendance records and child records are to be confidential and not viewed by parents.

Comments:	Two staff members did not accurately report how many children were within their groups at time of inspection. Licensing had to direct educators and administrator to divide the children into groups in order to complete accurate head counts and to cross reference numbers with attendance records in order to account for all children. Staff must know how many children they have at any given time.

Comments: The curtain was not drawn when licensing staff arrived for inspection. There were 33 children within 1 room at this time, exceeding the maximum group size. This contributed to a lack of supervision, and children being unaccounted for within the room. It was reported by multiple people that the curtain is frequently not drawn and that maximum group size is often exceeded within the indoor environment.					

General Comments

During today's inspection the curtain was open and one space was created for all children present (three separate camps). Educators and children do not have a space of their own.

Environments do not demonstrate a sense of belonging and ownership. Providing children with opportunities to care for and design their learning environment encourages a sense of pride and creates respect for the environment. Examples: children work together to tidy after snacks and meals, group discussions on how the environment should look, group art projects displayed, photos of the children, cozy areas and invitations that respond to the children's interests, etc.

Recommend assigning staff to specific daily tasks to help keep the centre organized and clean (previously recommended on monitoring inspection dated August 25/21). There was no progress noted since this last monitoring inspection.

Recommending that Extreme Allergy Management Plan be completed for child with anaphylactic allergy. Child currently has an administration of medication form completed that is kept with the child's Epipen.

Orders for compliance from previous Monitoring Inspection remain outstanding. When orders for compliance are left during inspections, the expectation is that orders are rectified by or before the comply by date indicated.
