General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on March 7, 2025.

Children were observed during indoor free play and snack time. Proper handwashing procedures were followed during snack. Steps or platforms were available to ensure children could safely reach regular-sized toilets and sinks. Educators shared that children are currently interested in transportation, learning to set the table at lunchtime, and being active outdoors in the afterschool program. During the inspection, children were engaged with glow-in-the-dark loose parts, gross motor activities in the gym, and a sensory table filled with rice and accessories. Educators were observed using positive language and providing gentle reminders to support children's learning and behavior.

The facility maintains a daily incident log, and parents are informed of incidents. Incident report forms are completed for any reportable occurrences. Outdoor play is scheduled for at least one hour in each four-hour block when the majority of children are present, weather permitting. All nap equipment meets the required minimum thickness of 5 cm. Snacks are provided at least every three hours, and meals are served during recognized meal periods. The daily routine is posted in each room, along with the weekly menu, which includes any substitutions. Evacuation procedures are clearly posted in a prominent location, and life-threatening allergies are documented and displayed.

Books reflecting children's current interests have been selected. Well-defined learning and play areas were observed, and children's artwork was displayed throughout the facility. Diaper-changing procedures are visibly posted for caregivers completing diaper changes. Drinking water is available throughout the day, and allergy information for children is posted in the food preparation area. The infant outdoor play area is separate from other children's play areas or used at different times. Daily activities are purposefully planned and documented within the program. Opportunities for both individual and group experiences are available. Children's portfolios are being completed, and various forms of documentation were displayed throughout the facility.
