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<p>General Comments</p> <p>A monitoring inspection occurred in the morning.</p> <p>Infant Room One: Upon arrival, the infants were observed having sunscreen applied as they prepared to transition outdoors. Once outdoors, they joined Infant Room Two. Both groups were observed engaging in a variety of outdoor activities, including water play, dancing, listening to music, and playing with trucks. Educators indicated that the children are currently interested in outdoor play, balls, water play, books, and sensory activities specifically painting.</p> <p>Two-Year-Old Room and Three- to Four-Year-Old Room: The two-year-old children were observed finishing snack and preparing to transition outdoors, while the three- to four-year-old group was already outdoors.</p> <p>Educators indicated that the children in the two-year-old room are currently interested in dramatic play, specifically with play food, as well as music and books. While the three- to four-year-old children are interested in art, outdoor play, books, and music.</p> <p>Once together outdoors, the children engaged in a variety of activities such as water play, bubble blowing, drawing, using spinning chairs, riding play cars, and climbing on wooden planks.</p> <p>The rooms were well organized and inviting, offering a varied supply of age-appropriate materials, books, and toys.</p> <p>A clearly visible and prominent area was designated for the posting of the facility license, current monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. Additional documentation reviewed included incident logs, daily attendance records, daily information sheets, one educator file, and records of evacuation and monthly fire drills.</p> <p>A conversation took place with the administrator on the following:</p>
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General Comments

- Educators to ensure that art materials in Infant Room One are always accessible to the children.
- Educators to ensure that all infant milk stored in the refrigerator in Infant Room One is labeled with the individual child's name.
- Purposeful planning was not evident in Infant Room One. Evidence of purposeful planning should be visible through invitations, documentation, and planned activities. Educators are required to review the Operator's Manual, Section 7: Programming and Daily Routine.
