<p>General Comments</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Early-morning visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection -Ratio was respected during the visit -The administrator as well as all educators have a valid first aid certificate -The administrator and staff have their one-year Early childhood education certificate -An inhaler was found on the administrator's desk. It was locked, during the visit. Children have access to that space daily for children's safety, all medication needs to be in a locked space. -During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations. Open-end questions are asked and guidance is given in a respectful and kind way -Toxic products, and cleaning supplies are locked under key and are inaccessible to children -Each child has an easily accessible space to store their personal belongings, which is labeled with their name and used only for the intended child. -A warm beverage was found on the administrator's desk. It was discussed that since children have access to the desk and cubby area that all warm beverages should be kept in spill proof cup. -Outdoor play area consists of more than one surface to permit different types of play -Outdoor material is varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present -Outdoor play area is maintained safe and free of hazards -The outdoor play area has at least 0.45m² of shade for each child based on the maximum number of children that can be accommodated in the outdoor play area <p>Observations: When arriving at the center children were eating their snack, once they were done they all got</p>
