<p>Comments: The wooden log platform has sharp edges, splintering wood, and rough edges. It needs to be sanded and treated in order to be used by the children. It also has open spaces where children's legs or arms could end up being entrapped. Please refrain from using it until it is fixed. It is not developmentally appropriate for the proposed 2's and the 3 year olds on the license.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">It is my understanding that the bridge is currently not being used as it needs to be lowered into the ground to be developmentally appropriate. Educators must continue to keep children off it until it is at appropriate height for children.</p>

Comments: The log platform structure requires surfacing to cushion any fall that may occur.
