General Comments

Both groups of children were playing with either slim or playdough when I arrived for today's monitoring inspection. Children who were playing with slim were eager to explain to me what color their slim was, that it had sparkles in it, and that it made purple by mixing two different colors together. The other group was exited to show me the different color playdough they were playing with and the tools they were using while playing with playdough.

All educators were observed interacting with children at time of inspection. They were observed sitting and playing with children and reading them stories.

During today's monitoring inspection, the indoor environment was observed to contain a wide variety of play materials that follow the values and beliefs of the New Brunswick Curriculum Framework for Early Learning and Childcare. These materials included many natural pieces such as Wicker baskets, wooden blocks, pinecones, and other natural resources.

The outside environment also offers an abundance of natural play material for the children to play with, from a wooden bridge, to lose parts, stumps/benches, and a boat, etc.
