General Comments							
Completed renewal inspection today. Screening procedures are being implemented for essential visitors, and group/visitor logs are being completed. Facility has a cleaning schedule in place and the environment appeared clean and organized. Invitations were set up throughout the facility in various interest centers for the children to explore. Educators are supporting communication/literacy by strategically placing books throughout the environment to capture the children's interests and ensuring that materials are readily accessible for mark making (paint, markers, calendars, pastels, etc.). Opportunities are also available for sensory exploration in the form of sand, modelling clay, and play dough. The educators noted that mud has become a new found interest of the children's stimulated by the mass rainfall that occurred earlier this week. The educators reported that the children were able to get outside and play in the mud and rain and that photos were taken to document this as well. The children were engaged in gross motor activities outside today and were observed running down the hill chasing wooden circles (dizzy play). Topics of interest (ex: babies/dolls, construction using natural materials like sticks) were easily identifiable within each room. Various forms of documentation within the rooms allows for opportunities for the children to revisit their past experiences and creates opportunities for conversations furthering communication and literacies. Evidence of inclusiveness and positive identities is also highlighted within the children's learning stories around the room. Recommending the addition of creative art materials for the upstairs group of children. Also recommend tightening the handles on the wooden fridge upstairs. Hand washing, and diaper changing was observed during today's inspection. The play deck off of the upstairs room is not currently being used as some boards need to be replaced.
