Comments: While reviewing staff files, Licensing Staff observed that a Social Development Check had expired. A conversation was had with the Administrator, who advised that a new Social Development Check will be completed as soon as possible.			

General Comments
Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to conduct the Renewal Inspection. Due to the low number of children in attendance today, all children were together in one classroom. Upon arrival, a variety of activities were prepared and available for the children to engage in as they arrived for morning drop-off. At one table, an Educator sat with a group of children who were coloring. The children were able to look through a large binder and select from a variety of coloring sheets, including Disney characters, cupcakes, ocean creatures, and other designs. At another table, children were observed using playdough to roll, stack, and create various shapes. The children were settled and actively engaged in the activities throughout the morning exploration period. The children worked together to clean up in preparation for morning snack. Educators were observed sanitizing the tables and ensuring that all children had their lunch boxes and water bottles. The indoor environment was organized, tidy, bright, and inviting. Materials were stored in clearly labeled, easily accessible bins. Several large collaborative art pieces were displayed throughout the classroom as well as pictures of the children and a birthday wall. Following morning snack, the children prepared to transition outdoors. Sunscreen was applied, water bottles were filled, and Educators ensured that all children were wearing hats. A headcount was conducted prior to transitioning outside. The outdoor play area is fully fenced and provides several shaded areas through mature trees and sun shades. While playing outdoors, a child hurt their head while playing. An Educator was observed getting an ice pack, checking the child over for visible marks, and completed an incident report. The Educator remained with the child until they were ready to return to play.

General Comments

The transition indoors for lunch was smooth and well organized. Children washed their hands upon entering the classroom and then sat together to eat their lunch. Following lunch, children who typically nap transitioned to the three-year-old classroom, while the older children participated in quiet-time activities.

Throughout the Renewal Inspection, Educators were observed using positive child guidance techniques. The children appeared settled, engaged, and comfortable in the environment, and the daily routines and transitions were smooth.
