<p>General Comments</p> <p>Licensing staff arrived in the morning to conduct a monitoring visit. The 3-year-olds are a small group located in a smaller classroom, and the environment is cozy, clean, and well decorated with the children's artwork featuring a great tree up the wall with family photos all around. They have a hand-washing sink, lots of storage shelves, tables for lunch and art projects and a reading area with a rug. Today their educator read them a book called "Try A Little Kindness" by Henry Cole about animal friends modeling being kind to one another. The children were very engaged in telling their own stories and the educator was very patient and attentive to what they had to say. They voted for which song to sing for the end of circle time, which involved some discussion of the process and how it works. The children had snack, free play, and then everyone went outside to play. When they returned, they had a craft activity on tractors as this week's theme is farm week. This group naps after lunch and then because the day was really warm, they played inside. The outside play area has a large space with monkey bars and climbers, and pea gravel and a smaller accessible play area with special surfacing, special swings, a play wall that can be manipulated, and a spinner/carousel that a wheelchair can fit on. This space was developed with inclusion funding, but everyone can use it. The outdoor play area has grass, a space to dig, a mud kitchen, storage and a hut for the Forest School. More shade will need to be added soon as the weather is warming up quickly.</p> <p>The four-year old group is larger, and on Tuesday and Thursday mornings this group spends the morning outside. They follow the NB Curriculum but Forest School elements are incorporated. Their classroom is larger and contains a wooden cabin with a covered small mattress for relaxing and a bag of fidgets. They have a reading section with a rug and lots of books, kitchen, work bench and tools, dress up section with purses, lots of loose parts like animals, dinosaurs, cars, lego and blocks. This room also has a handwashing sink. the Learning stories were all divided by month and there were lots of examples of artwork and learning activities.</p> <p>The younger afterschool is also on this license and they arrived around 2:30 or so. Today they had snack, did some arts and crafts, and stayed inside due to the overly warm weather.</p> <p>Attendances were verified, parent board postings and child and staff files. Everything was well organized and up to date. All child guidance was positive, and the staff are very patient and kind with the children. The</p>
