Comments:	Food debris, sand, and small toy pieces were noted on the floors throughout the rooms. Tables within Pod 3 were unclean from clay from the previous day as well. It was evident that the floors had not been cleaned prior to the children's arrival either. Cleaning schedule/responsibilities to be reviewed with staff. These environments should be cleaned at the end of the day. This should not be happening after children arrive for care the following day.

	Pod 2: The black table on the back wall storing the Lego near the window is wobbly and not sturdy-to be repaired or replaced. Signage on the kitchen for the "café" is ripped. Remove/replace. Shelving units within the dramatic play area are unclean.						
	Pod 3: Sticky residue noted on computer lap top and computer table. These should be cleaned/disinfected regularly.						
	Two of the 3 tables in the room are also covered with Mac Tac and are peeling-to be repaired/replaced with new tables.

Comments:	The kitchen door was left open for the duration of the inspection today. Advised staff members that this should be closed to be inaccessible to the children. A half door could be installed if desired.						

General Comments

Completed renewal inspection today.

Children were observed within their indoor environments. The temperature was below -20 today and the children did not spend time outdoors this afternoon.

The children freely circulated between interest centers. The educators were observed interacting with the children, and providing support.

Interests and purposeful planning was discussed with some of the educators.

The older school age group were observed watching a movie and playing video games on the lap tops. Digital technologies may be used but educators must ensure that this is limited and not over used to fill gaps of time. The educator in the room today was observed supervising these activities and ensuring that the content was appropriate.

There are no life threatening allergies at this time and no Epipens. Ensure that Epipens are never locked and that they are inaccessible to children but easily accessible to staff in an emergency.
