Purpose of visit on this date was to complete the annual renewal inspection. It was raining on this date and children were engaged in cutting, gluing and colouring upon arrival of licensing staff. Operator modeled and facilitated turn taking and sharing. Positive behaviour guidance was observed at all times. Younger children were very interesting in using the wavy scissors and the operator helped them by holding the paper while the cut it several times.

The operator has been incorporating the Spanish language into their daily routine as one child in attendance speaks Spanish as their first language and is still learning English. All children have been learning Spanish songs and words to create an inclusive environment.

One child had entered some artwork she had made while in attendance into the Old Home Week fair in Woodstock and had won first place. This child was very proud of this accomplishment and the artwork and ribbon was displayed.

Children and staff files were well organized and contained all required documentation. Fire drills and playground inspections have been completed monthly. Fence surrounding the outdoor play space is now completed.

Floors appear much cleaner then on previous visits. Indoor play area did have many play items on the floor upon arrival. The operator appeared to be doing much of the toy and material clean up herself. Children can be encouraged to clean up their play space to help with this task. Creating a routine around clean up time can help children to engaged in cleaning and have a sense of independence. Songs, games and modeling can be used to establish this routine.

Licensing staff can recommend home for licensing.
