Comments: While the main area is enclosed by a gated fence, there is a small area outside the fence with picnic tables that was used by the infants during the inspection. Licensing staff observed the infants return from a walk and remain outside the fenced area for 10 minutes. Infants did remain seated at the picnic table and the educator had paper, dabbers and crayons for the infants.			
31(8) The outdoor play area of a full-time or part-time early learning and childcare centre at which services are provided to infants and children of another age group shall (a) include a separate area for the infants, or (b) be used by the infants and the children of another age group at different times.	31(8)	Jul 06, 2023	
Comments: The two year old classes and the infants used the outdoor play space at the same time during the inspection.			

<b>General Comments</b>
<p>All groups were having outdoor play time in the morning. Some infants are doing their transition week and some parents were on site.</p> <p>The outdoor play space had numerous surfaces for the infants and preschoolers to explore- artificial turf, a gazebo, mulch, and a stone walkway. There were rocking toys, push cars, balls, and shovels. A large storage bin with a well-fitting lid provides storage for other toys.</p> <p>Educators remained thoroughly engaged with children. Educators were observed sitting and playing peek a boo, playing hide and seek, and anticipating needs such as a drink of water or wiping noses. Child guidance was positive, and educators provided children with hugs, extra reassurance, and comfort while using a soft voice at the children's level.</p> <p>All rooms were clean and supplied with well-maintained furnishings and materials. Multiple postings and documentation were on the bulletin boards and walls- family photos, pictures of children, recent art, newsletters and calendars with programming. The Senior Nursery had a display of laminated pictures of realistic looking</p>

safari animals, and they were attached to the board with clothespins so they can be removed for the children to look at.

Toys and resources were stored in bins and baskets which were easily accessible to the children and labels included photos of the items or text.

Educators followed the interests of the children. In the 2's Raccoon Room, there was an easel with a whiteboard and chalkboard and a shelf with blocks and a toy garbage truck. In the Junior Nursey, the educator has a basket of different blankets that the infants like to play with as a sensory activity.

Staff, child and administrative files were verified and contained all required documentation.
