Comments: Licensing staff observed that several nap mats in the twos classroom were ripped, exposing the absorbent foam inside. Please ensure that these mats are replaced so they remain washable and maintained in good condition.			

<p>General Comments</p> <p>Licensing staff conducted the renewal inspection.</p> <p>Upon arrival, most groups were finishing snack while educators cleaned the tables and prepared the children for outdoor play by assisting with bathroom routines. The infant groups transitioned outside to their designated play area. Another infant group was already outdoors engaged in play. The outdoor environment offered a variety of age-appropriate materials, including mini four-wheelers, lawn mowers, bikes, push cars, instruments, toy cars, soft jumping mats, and small slides. Educators were observed singing with the children, encouraging play, wiping noses as needed, and maintaining consistent supervision throughout the outdoor time.</p> <p>The twos and threes groups also transitioned outdoors to their designated play space. Educators were engaged with the children, asking questions and supporting play. One educator facilitated a bubble activity by encouraging the children to explore different materials that could be used to make bubbles. Soap was poured onto a tray so children could dip and test various items. Positive child guidance was observed when educators supported children through conflict by encouraging problem solving, asking questions such as, "What can we do to help them feel better?". The outdoor space was organized, with labelled bins and a variety of accessible materials available to the children. Children were also observed exploring bugs outdoors while educators facilitated discussion by asking questions about the insects they found.</p> <p>A discussion was had with administration regarding the woodchips in the outdoor play spaces. Please ensure that all zones remain adequately covered. Additional woodchips are needed near the brick ledge in the infant area, as well as around the structure in the twos and threes play area.</p> <p>One infant group transitioned indoors earlier for lunch. Educators completed diapering routines, engaged the children in free play and music, and assisted the infants during lunch while seated in highchairs. The remaining</p>

groups transitioned indoors where handwashing and bathroom routines were completed before lunch. Books were set out for children to explore while transitions took place. During lunch, educators also prepared the rooms for nap time by setting up cribs for younger infants and nap mats for older children.

Following nap time, groups transitioned into free play and snack time. One group was observed exploring a sensory bin containing natural materials collected from outdoors.

Documentation and evidence of curriculum were displayed throughout the classrooms. Positive child guidance practices were observed throughout the inspection, and monthly fire drills are being completed. Staff and child files were checked and in compliance.

Licensing staff will recommend renewal once the identified deficiency has been brought into compliance.
