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General Comments
A renewal inspection was conducted at the Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) Home. Upon arrival, licensing staff observed the operator/educator transitioning the children to outdoor play. During this transition, diaper-changing procedures were carried out appropriately, and the operator was observed engaging positively with the children by singing to and with them. Licensing staff observed a variety of age-appropriate, child-safe materials available within the indoor play environment for all children in this mixed-age group. Resources included large cardboard blocks, alphabet blocks, a colour-changing light table with translucent materials, large rubber and hard LEGO-style blocks, Little People figures and accessories, and a well-stocked art area containing paper, stickers, and Crayola Project Markers designed for young children. A dramatic play area was set up with a play kitchen, lemonade stand, and related accessories. A cozy book corner contained a selection of board books, and a dress-up centre offered age-appropriate clothing and accessories for imaginative play. Prior to outdoor play, licensing staff observed the operator applying sunscreen to the children. The outdoor play environment has been enhanced to provide multiple play surfaces and experiences for children. The area includes a paved surface, artificial grass, sand play areas, and mulched areas featuring natural materials. While outdoors, children were observed engaging in a variety of activities, including playing at the water table with spray bottles, scooping and transferring water between containers, playing with trucks in the sand, painting, creating marks with chalk on the pavement, and using the slide. Children were also observed exploring the wooded hill and trails, confidently climbing over roots and natural terrain while searching for "bears" during imaginative play. These experiences demonstrated opportunities for exploration, creativity, and the development of gross motor skills. Licensing staff also observed the children transitioning indoors for lunch. With assistance from the operator, children changed out of their wet clothing, washed their hands, and ate lunch together as a group. Following lunch, children transitioned to diaper-changing routines and then to their beds for nap/quiet time.

General Comments

Throughout the inspection, licensing staff observed that all children were appropriately supervised by the operator at all times while in her care.

The operator's file, as well as the files of all associated persons, were reviewed and verified as complete, containing all required documentation. A review of all children's files was also conducted, and all required documentation was found to be present and complete.

Based on the observations made during the inspection and the review of required documentation, the ELC Home is recommended for license renewal.
