Comments: Standards require that preschool outdoor play areas be fully enclosed by appropriate fencing.			

<p><b>General Comments</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Early-morning visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection</li> <li>-Ratio was respected during the visit</li> <li>-The administrator as well as all educators have a valid first aid certificate</li> <li>-The administrator and more than 50% of the staff have their one-year Early childhood education certificate</li> <li>-Medications are locked and inaccessible to children, administration of medication records are evident.</li> <li>-Medication used for anaphylactic shock (EPIPEN) are stored safely (inaccessible to children) but easy to access for staff</li> <li>-During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations. Open-end questions are asked and guidance is given in a respectful and kind way</li> <li>-Toxic products, and cleaning supplies are locked under key and are inaccessible to children</li> <li>-Each child has an easily accessible space to store their personal belongings, which is labeled with their name and used only for the intended child.</li> <li>-Standards require that preschool outdoor play areas be fully enclosed by appropriate fencing. However, the designated outdoor space for preschool children is not fully fenced, as the fence was removed during the demolition of the former Presbyterian. Pictures will be sent to QAM once the fence is fixed.</li> <li>-Children's indoor play area is safe and clean</li> <li>- Material and equipment proposed to children in the indoor play area are easily accessible on low, open shelves. It is varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present.</li> <li>-A first-aid kit and a phone are always accessible on site and on outings.</li> <li>-A lifeguard is on duty when accessing a public pool or public swimming area</li> </ul> <p>Observations: When arriving at the center all children were outside, the afterschool were into their Olympic games. The preschool children were having a kitchen party, playing music and cooking in their mud kitchen. Preschool children came in to wash their hands and have a free play period before lunch, afterschool children were getting ready to come inside when I was leaving.</p>
