General Comments

Upon arrival, some of the preschool children were playing in the outdoor play space. The school-age children were in the gym. The gym has been divided into two spaces; one for the younger school age children and the other half for the older school age children. There is a variety of materials including lego, blocks, building materials, art materials, books, puzzles and games, dramatic play including a kitchen area. The children were spaced out in different areas and were engaged in conversation and play. Two of the children were in conflict, as one of the children was breaking the others creation. The educator walked directly to them, moved to their level and helped them sort it out by mediating. During my visit, other positive child examples were used, such as, redirection. The educator gave the children choices to move into different learning areas to resolve the conflict between the children. Also observed, was a child hitting another child and the educator intervened and modeled the words; "please don't hit me, I don't like that." The educators were observed as present and engaged at all times.

The two year old room educators have flourished when it comes to documenting the children's learning. Many pictures of the children are displayed in the play area, along with learning stories to complement the planned activities. The educators are idea jotting and journaling. The educators are doing their best to provide a child lead environment. The children's quote wall was also a great addition to the classroom. Although the environment is small, the area has been set up with materials for the children to engage in. This includes but is not limited to a tuff board, dinosaurs, blocks and building materials, books, art materials, as well as, a kitchen and sink area.

Please have the educators in the two year old room build on their pre-planned program based on the children's interests as discussed. All staff should review the section on digital technologies in the Operator manual. Educators must know what children are playing, watching and accessing when on any device.

The outdoor play area needs more accessories for each of the learning centres. These can be brought in from the inside. Invitations for play can also be set up prior to using the outdoor play area. Learning centres materials will change depending on the season but should be set up accordingly. It was great to see that sand was added to the sand box. The children were engaged in sand play at the time of arrival.
