### General Comments

- Early-morning visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection
- Ratio was respected in all groups during the visit
- The administrator as well as all educators have a valid first aid certificate
- The administrator and more than 50% of the staff have their Early Childhood Education certificate
- When acetaminophen is administered to a child, the consent form is signed by the parent and kept into the children file.
- Administration of medication records are evident
- Medications are locked in the kitchen and inaccessible to children
- Daily routine into the center includes; Outdoor play time at least once every 4-hour blocks time when the weather is permitting. Meal and snacks are served at the recognized hours and a daily rest period that meets the children's needs.
- During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations. Open-end questions are asked and guidance is given in a respectful and kind way
- Outdoor play area is maintained safe and free of hazards
- Infant outdoor play area is separate from preschool and school age children
- In the outdoor play area children have more than one type of surfacing to play and explore, the material offered is varied and in sufficient quantity for children present
- A first-aid kit and a phone are always accessible on site and on outings.
- Each child has an easily accessible space to store their personal belongings, which is labeled with their name and used only for the intended child.

Observations: When arriving all children were outside, some of them even had snacks outside. A library was set up in the playhouse that is in the preschool playground, children were involved in playing librarian, others were playing in the sand, building and digging, while another group was drawing on the easel, or visiting the garden. The infant playground offers a variety of zones, like a water wall, a large sand box, a playhouse, a drawing corner with an easel and a chalk board, mud kitchen and a gross motor area. All the groups came in to wash their hands and get ready for lunch, the youngest was getting ready for nap when I was leaving.
