General Comments

Name of operator

The QA Monitor is on site for a monitoring inspection. During the inspection, the QA Monitor was able to observe during lunch time and during the nap time. Positive child guidance and positive interactions were observed between the children and the educators.

A purposely planned activity for father's day was observed during the visit. Meaningful conversations during the activity displayed the educator's engagement.

During the inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor has noticed that there is a pile of fence pieces next to the walkway that is used by the school age children to get to their fenced in play space. Since the QA Monitor has seen nails portruding from several boards, the Quality Assurance Monitor strongly recommends moving them to an area that is not accessible to children.

While doing an inspection of the school age children outdoor play area, the QA Monitor has observed that in one of the play bins (used for water play or sand play), the bin was full of dirty stagnant water. Since there has been a significant ammount of rain in the past days, the Quality Assurance Monitor recommends that the water be drained to respect Public Health guidelines.

While observing the preschool outdoor play space, the Quality Assurance Monitor has noticed that a section of the wooden fence is detached from the other segment of the fence. This has created a gap in the outdoor play
