General Comments

In the 3's room, children were finishing up their free play and preparing for snack. The main educator read a story to the children and paused throughout to ask questions and listen to comments. Before eating, all children washed their hands. Educators provided assistance while still encouraging the children to practice independence. The children were familiar with the routine of the morning.

Snack time was also observed in the 4/5-year-old classroom. The children and educator were having a discussion about the dentist and the educator expanded on this topic by asking the children additional questions. The educator also ensured that each child had a turn to share their thoughts and ideas during the conversation.

In the 4-year-old room, children were also having snack time. The educator was sitting with the children. Flexibility in routine allowed for a child to remain on the carpet playing.

All three rooms were organized, clean and had an abundance of accessible materials for the children. Bins were labeled with both illustrations and text. Furniture is arranged to define learning areas.

Purposeful planning was evident in all rooms. Children are preparing for Father's Day and planting vegetables. Monthly calendars and newsletters were posted in all rooms along with a number of learning stories which made connections to the Curriculum Framework.

All three groups were observed in the outdoor play space. The fence was secure and well-maintained. There were balls, trucks, helicopters, an outdoor kitchen, several wagons, and loose parts for creative play. The 4/5-year-old group was doing a treasure hunt with a treasure box and maps. The 4-year-old group was playing in the mud kitchen creating birthday cakes and muffins. Please drill holes into the tires to ensure proper water drainage.

Staff and child files were reviewed. All required information and documents were present. Potential illness forms, administration of medication and return after exclusion forms are being used. Fire drill and outdoor checklists were complete.
