Comments: In a sample of 6 child profiles verified, 2 child profiles had an incomplete address for the 2-emergency contact information. The city part or the postal code was missing. The administrator must ensure that all the child profiles are complete.			

General Comments
The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site in the Afternoon to conduct a Monitoring Inspection. The child to staff ratio was respected during the inspection. The following elements were verified: - Daily activities - If all required documents are posted in a visible place in the facility - Child records - Signed consent in the child's file - Incident records - Child guidance - Health - Premises - Safety - Transportation The Quality Assurance Monitor observed that only the half-day routine was posted in a visible and prominent place in the facility. The Quality Assurance Monitor asks that a full-day routine is also created and posted in the facility.

General Comments

The Quality Assurance Monitor discussed with the responsible educator the use of the school's outdoor playground. Although the playground is owned by the school, children are permitted to use it during school closures. The operator must conduct a daily safety inspection before allowing children access to the playground. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed rust developing on the handrails of the steps leading to the yellow slide in the playground. Children may continue to use the slide, however it must be inspected daily to ensure no sharp edges are exposed and that the condition of the slide and handrails does not deteriorate further.

The Quality Assurance Monitor observed the children playing in the outdoor play area and transitioning inside to eat their lunch (lunch boxes). The children were also observed playing in the indoor play area with Legos, big wooden blocks, creating jellyfish with art material. The children also played in the gym area with small sitting scooters and with soccer balls and badminton. Positive interactions were observed between the educators and the children.
