General Comments

Renewal inspection completed today. The educators were observed to be engaged with the children through conversations, asking open ended questions and singing. Hand washing and meal time routines were observed. There are currently no children attending who nap.

Documentation was plentiful and displayed in various forms (photos, webs, creative art, models, collages, etc.) throughout the facility. Topics of interest were easily identifiable within the environment. The children are currently exploring birds, fish, under the sea, plants, bees and space. The educators have added materials and equipment to the environment to support these interests. Children were observed to be engaged in creative art, dramatic play, exploring books and "fishing" with their hand made fishing rods and clothespins throughout today's visit. The educators have incorporated literacy throughout the indoor environment and have also begun to implement signage (ex: names of plants that the children have planted within their garden) within the outdoor play area as well. The children appeared to enjoy their time outdoors and were observed playing outdoors in the morning and afternoon today.

Discussed school aged children playing in the wooded area behind the fenced in play area. The educators could be within the fenced in play area with the other children as this would be considered indirect supervision. This is permitted for this age group.

Ensure surfacing is replenished as needed within outdoor play area to meet manufacturer requirements for climbing dome and under swings.
