Comments:  During the inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor verified a new staff members record. The proof of registration for the first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation training was in the staff records but the proof of completion was not in the file. The administrator on-site immediately contacted the First Aid certification providers, and they were able to send a proof of certification immediately. A copy was inserted in the staff file. Deficiency is now compliant								

## **General Comments**

Name of operator

The Quality Assurance Monitor is on-site for a monitoring inspection. During the monitoring inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor was able to observe the children during snack, indoor free play, transition to outdoor free play and outdoor free play. The Quality Assurance Monitor observe an educator being attentive to children's needs by validating their feelings when they were crying and being very patient and respecting their needs in the moment. The educator observed engaged in discussions with their children and asked them questions during their free play.

The Quality Assurance also verified one staff file whose criminal record check and check with Social Development had been expired. All required checks were valid and up to date. The ratio was respected while the Quality Assurance Monitor was on-site.

## **General Comments**

The Quality Assurance Monitor and the Early Learning Consultant had a discussion with the administrator regarding the transitions to outdoor free play. The Quality Assurance Monitor has shared concerns over communications when needing support and has made some recommendations to ensure that staff can reach out for support when needed. The Quality Assurance Monitor also highlighted some concerns over a route that the children are taking to go into the outdoor play area as the route was creating some blind spots where proper supervision could be compromised. In order to mitigate risks, the Quality Assurance Monitor recommended that the administration review their strategies for moving children.

The administrator has confirmed that they will take the suggestions into considerations and discuss their options. This element will be re-verified during the next monitoring inspection in order to assess the changes that have been made to promote communication and to mitigate risks.
