Comments: During today's Renewal Inspection, Licensing Staff observed a large bin with the children's napping items such as blankets were touching one another. A conversation was had on site about ensuring the children's belongings are being stored separately.			

General Comments
Licensing staff arrived at the facility to conduct the annual renewal inspection. Upon arrival, all classrooms were washing their hands in preparation for the morning snack. Snack time was observed in each classroom. After the children finished eating, their water bottles were filled, and the groups transitioned to the outdoor play area. The children were observed playing on the newer playground, which has several mature trees that provide ample shade. The infants were observed having water play at a large sensory bin with balls, cups, and rubber ducks. As their interest shifted, they moved to another fenced outdoor play area. Throughout the morning, educators regularly reminded the children to take water breaks. Later, the groups transitioned back inside, one classroom at a time to prepare for lunch. Each child had a labeled hook for storing their personal belongings. During lunch, educators sat with the children, eating together and engaging them in conversation. In one of the 4/5-year-old classrooms, the children gathered to read "The Little Beaver". The Educator engaged with the group throughout the story, pausing to ask questions and asking what they thought was going to happen next. After lunch, the children cleaned their hands and faces before transitioning to nap time. In the older 4/5-year-old classroom, some children chose to play with LEGO at a table while others spent time reading books, coloring and playing with magnetic cubes. Only positive child guidance practices were observed throughout the inspection. Educators were heard used kind words, encouragement, praise, and offering hugs. Staff and children's files were reviewed and contained all
