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General Comments

Nancy Glendenning attempted to do the annual inspection at facility prior to closure for the summer. The administrator was present and stated that there were no children present and was cleaning out the classroom.

Licensing staff will return in the fall to complete the inspection.

Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to conduct the Renewal Inspection. Upon arrival, the children had just arrived from school dismissal. The Educator assisted children who required help changing into their indoor shoes, and the children were signed into the attendance records.

The children were observed engaging in free play and discussing the plan for the afternoon. A group of children played several rounds of Beyblades, while others engaged in board games, played with dolls, and participated in imaginative play in the kitchen area. Later in the afternoon, the Educator announced that it was time to clean up and wash hands in preparation for afternoon snack. One Educator accompanied the children to the washrooms while the other Educator sanitized the tables.

Today was Science Day, and the children were excited to make their own ice cream as part of a science experiment. Some of the older children assisted the Educator with gathering the ingredients, Ziploc bags, and spoons. Participation in the activity was optional. Several children sat together and followed the steps to make the ice cream, while a few children chose to continue playing with Beyblades. Once the ice cream was ready, all children were given the opportunity to try it. The children were heard commenting on how delicious the ice cream they had made was. Shortly afterward, the children gathered their personal belongings and transitioned outside for end-of-day pick-up.

It was evident that the Educators have established strong, positive relationships with the children and have taken the time to get to know their individual interests and personalities. The Educators remained engaged with the children throughout the afternoon by participating in games, holding conversations, and interacting with them during snack and the ice cream-making activity. Staff and child profiles were organized and contained all required documentation.

Licensing Staff recommends the facility for Renewal.
