General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on February 26, 2025.

Children were observed during snack time and engaged in indoor free play. Educators noted that the children are currently very interested in drawing portraits of their families, creating shapes with loose parts in the sensory bin, listening to Celtic music, and being active outdoors. Educators were observed using positive language and giving gentle reminders. They have also included themselves and their personal interests within their documentation.

Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and posted accordingly. A clearly visible and prominent area is designated to display the license, current inspection report, monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. The daily routine is posted, and evacuation procedures are displayed in a prominent location. The room is thoughtfully arranged, inviting children to explore and engage in play. Materials are intentionally set up to stimulate curiosity and participation.

Books reflecting the children's interests have been carefully selected. Several well-defined learning centers are present, including areas for building, reading, dramatic play, and science. A sensory area is available with sufficient materials and accessories to support sensory play. Toxic products, such as chemical cleaners, are securely locked and inaccessible to children. The changing area is within one meter of a sink, and diaperchanging procedures are posted and visible to staff performing diaper changes. Drinking water is readily available throughout the day. The infant outdoor play area is either separate or used at different times than the other age groups.

Opportunities for both individual and group experiences are offered. Various forms of literacy are integrated throughout the indoor environment. Portfolios are actively being completed with the children, who also have access to their own portfolios. Several forms of documentation were observed throughout the facility, showcasing the children's learning experiences and interests.

A conversation occurred with the Operator regarding the facility's strengths and areas for improvement. Identified strengths included opportunities for children to express creativity, explore the arts and sciences,
