 -Visit to the learning center for an unexpected monitoring inspection -Ratio was respected during the visit -Toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies are locked and inaccessible to children -Centre has the proper number of functioning and available toilets and sinks, one potty chair or training seat is provided, and a step or platforms are provided to allow children to reach regular sized toilets or sinks. -Posted in a visible and prominent place in the facility are the following documents: The license, inspection report, orders for compliance, daily routine, evacuation procedures, name of administrator, name and telephone number of QA Monitor and Inspector Life-threatening allergies and a notice to inform parents of the existence of a communicable disease. -Daily activities into the center shows purposely planned and documented programming that gives children, Time, and space for a free choice of play experiences, indoor and outdoor opportunities for physical activity either individually or in a group. Children have opportunities for various forms of literacy and to express creativity and interests, to explore the arts and sciences and to experience accomplishment and success. They have opportunities to problem solve and to develop trusting, respectful and supportive relationships. -An inclusive environment is provided for all children -Children's guidance is done in a respectful and positive way -Daily routine into the center includes: Outdoor play time at least once every 4 hour blocks time, when the weather is permitting. Meal and snacks are served at the recognized hours and a daily rest period that meets the children's needs. Observations: When arriving at the center, the threes went outside while the four-year-old were practicing their songs for their preschool graduation. The infants and the two's played outside and painted snow when coming in they got ready for lunch and went to sleep.
