General Comments

- Mid-morning visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection
- Ratio was respected during the visit.
- It was observed during the visit that children are guided on how to express their feeling and use words when being hurt, angry, frustrated, sad...and the other part involved is shown how to listen and repair their actions.
- One of the rooms was not used, all the beds were set and ready for a nap, each napping child has a cot or nap mat that is appropriate for their height
- There is a space of at least 46 cm between rest equipment and all nap equipment is washable and non-absorbent
- Allergy information on any child is posted in the food preparation area
- Drinking water is provided throughout the day
- Food brought from home is labeled with the child's name and refrigerated or has an ice pack as required
- Snacks and lunches are provided by the operator, every day of the week, except on Wednesday parents provide snacks and lunches one day/week. When changes are made on the menu parents have a three-day notice
- In the outdoor play area children has more than one type of surfacing to play and explore, the material offered is varied and in sufficient quantity for children present
- The outdoor play area has at least 0.45m² of shade for each child based on the maximum number of children that can be accommodated in the outdoor play area
- Outdoor play area is maintained safe and free o hazards
- Infant outdoor play area is separate from preschool and school age children.
- Zones were added in the outside spaces; A corner with shelves, trucks and tracks was added, a corner with all the required tools to catch and observe insects, a corner with puppets, a garden...etc.
- In one of the room documentations was showing the progress of a walk in the woods, that turned into a search for sticks, that turned into a pretend fire, to end up being a camping trip with a tent.
- One of the groups is into a pirate team, they were out with pirate hats, eye patches and a map to find their treasure.

Observations: When arriving at the center three groups were playing outside, and the other two were working with Play-Doh and table games. All groups went outside and came in to get ready for lunch.
