General Comments						
A Monitoring Inspection occurred on July 24, 2024.						

Children were observed during outdoor free play. Educators stated that the children are currently very interested in family centres, exploring concepts of self-identity and belonging, participating in community outings, and topics related to the ocean. Educators have included themselves and their interests in their own documentation. Outdoors, educators are playing an active role in children's activities.

Parents of children present at the center are granted entry at any time. Outdoor play occurs for at least one hour in each four-hour block of time when the majority of children receiving services are in attendance, weather permitting. A clearly visible and prominent place is available to post the license, current inspection report, current monitoring reports, and orders for compliance. Evacuation procedures are posted and located in a prominent location. Life-threatening allergies are posted. The room is set up invitingly, with materials arranged to invite children to play. Ideas from the web and learning stories are reflected in the art area, library, kitchen, and dramatic play areas. Books have been selected to reflect the children's interests. Children's art has been displayed at eye level, with the child's name and date included. Traffic areas are kept clean, and outdoor walkways are free of clutter. Toxic products such as chemical products and cleaners are locked and inaccessible to the children. Drinking water is provided throughout the day. The infant outdoor play area is separate or used at different times than other children. Outdoor stationary equipment is surrounded by protective surfacing of appropriate depth.

Daily activities are purposefully planned and documented in the program. Opportunities are open for individual and group experiences. Various forms of literacy are present in the indoor environment. Opportunities to express creativity, explore the arts and sciences, experience accomplishments, problem-solve, and develop trusting, respectful, and supportive relationships are provided. Webs have been completed with the children and expanded upon with educators.
