## **General Comments**

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on October 30, 2024.

During the inspection, children were observed engaging in both indoor and outdoor play activities. Their interactions were lively and focused, showcasing their interests and creativity.

Educators shared that the children are currently enthusiastic about pumpkin carving, exploring the neighborhood, and collecting leaves for art projects. They are also enjoying sensory materials readily available on a tuff tray. Positive child guidance techniques were evident throughout the facility, including educators interacting at the children's level, providing appropriate supervision, using positive language, offering choices, and assisting children in their decision-making processes.

Outdoor play is scheduled for at least one hour in each four-hour block of time, ensuring that the majority of children receiving services can participate, weather permitting. Important documents such as the license, current inspection report, monitoring reports, and orders for compliance are posted in a clearly visible and prominent location.

The rooms are invitingly set up, with materials arranged to encourage play. Books have been thoughtfully selected to reflect the children's interests, and well-defined learning and play areas were observed. Several pieces of children's artwork were prominently displayed throughout the facility. A sensory area is available, equipped with a sufficient quantity of materials, and accessories are regularly rotated. Toxic products, such as cleaning supplies, are locked away to ensure children's safety, and drinking water is accessible throughout the
