General Comments

Part time preschool children were in the outdoor play space upon arrival of licensing staff. Children were dressed appropriately for the rainy weather and were enjoying playing in puddles with various cups and dippers. Other children played in the sand box and on the merry go round. The educator had a large bin filled with materials for the children to use within the outdoor space. Outdoor playground was well maintained and safe. Children were given a verbal prompt that they would be going inside in five minutes. Transition to indoors was smooth and the educator was observed counting the children out loud to ensure all were returning indoors. The educator set expectations of what the upcoming routine was and children responded positively to this. The parttime preschool program has been running for a few weeks since taking a break for the summer and all children appeared to be settled and well adjusted.

Children washed their hands and had snack at the table. Independance was encouraged at snack time and the educator modeled appropriate table manners.

Full time preschool room was well organized and clean. The materials available were supportive of a variety of play based experienced and a storage shelf allowed for materials to be exchanged based on the children's interests. Activity areas were well defined and children were engaged in play throughout the inspection.

School age children were observed within the indoor play space. All children attending were five and six years old and enjoyed many of the same materials that were available in the preschool room. Licensing staff discussed redirecting behaviours and programming with school age educator. Educator has been observing children to see their interests and will be implementing more invitations for play and setting intentions for the day based on these observations.

All documentation was up to date and filed appropriately. Centre can be recommended for licensing.
