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General Comments

Licensing staff arrived at the licensed facility to conduct the annual License Renewal Inspection.

Upon arrival, the school-aged group was indoors participating in free-play activities, while the preschool group was outdoors playing. The child-to-staff ratios were reviewed and found to be in compliance with the requirements of the Early Childhood Services Act.

In the school-aged classroom, educators had prepared invitations of play for the children. One activity consisted of a large container of coloured water with beads of various colours and sizes for exploration. A second activity involved mark-making materials, including markers, pencil crayons, and colouring sheets. During observations, children were engaged in various play centres and were observed interacting positively with peers through conversation and cooperative play.

The preschool-aged children were observed playing outdoors on the school playground. Some children were using the climbing structure and slide, while others were engaged in digging and pouring activities in the sandpit. Before returning indoors for lunch, the children also enjoyed playing on the merry-go-round.

Upon returning indoors, the preschool children changed into their indoor shoes and washed their hands before retrieving their lunch boxes from the designated storage area. Once all children had their lunches, they sat at the tables and ate their meals. After lunch, the children used the washroom, washed their hands, and then located their cots for rest time. All cots were arranged throughout the classroom with a minimum spacing of more than 46 centimetres between each cot, meeting regulatory requirements.

Recommendation

Please ensure that educators consistently use positive child guidance techniques when supporting and guiding children.

Based on observations made during the inspection, licensing staff recommends the facility for renewal of its license.
