### General Comments

- Morning visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection
- During the visit, ratio child-to-staff is maintained and respected in the same age and mixed age groups
- Monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills are completed
- The following administrative records are maintained on site: Financial records, daily attendance of children and staff, monthly emergency evacuation fire drills, smoke alarm, smoke detectors and fire extinguisher inspection and maintenance records
- Daily routine into the center includes; Outdoor play time at least once every 4 hour blocks time when the weather is permitting. Meal and snacks are served at the recognized hours and a daily rest period that meets the children's needs.
- Toxic products, and cleaning supplies are locked under key and are inaccessible to children
- Daily activities into the center shows purposely planned and documented programming that gives children, time and space for a free choice of play experiences, indoor and outdoor opportunities for physical activity either individually or in a group. Children have opportunities for various forms of literacy and to express creativity and interests, to explore the arts and sciences and to experience accomplishment and success. They have opportunities to problem solve and to develop trusting, respectful and supportive relationships.
- It was observed during the visit that children are guided on how to express their feeling and use words when being hurt, angry, frustrated, sad...and the other part involved being shown how to listen and repair their actions.
- In all rooms, evidence of purposeful planning based on children's interest and learning, webbing, invitation, photos and learning stories were posted.
- During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations.
- Children's indoor play area is safe and clean
- Material and equipment proposed to children in the indoor play area are easily accessible on low, open shelves. It is varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present.
- Material and equipment offered to the children in the indoor play area is safe, clean and in good repair.

Observations: When arriving at the center all children were getting ready to go outside, they were expecting a

special visit from a fire truck. When the preschool children came in, they transitioned into free play and all talks was all about the fire truck. The infant came in, got their diapers changed and were getting ready for lunch.
