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General Comments

Name of operator

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on July 4, 2025.

Children were observed during both indoor and outdoor free play as well as lunch. Proper handwashing was observed during the transition to lunch. Steps or platforms are provided to allow children to reach regular-sized toilets and sinks.

Educators shared that children are currently very interested in exploring sensory art using rice and quinoa, watering classroom plants, playing with a beach sensory bin, going for walks in the community, and engaging in ice cube and water play outdoors on hot days. Educators are actively involved in supporting children's activities outside.

The daily incident log is maintained consistently. Outdoor play occurs for at least one hour within every four-hour block of time, weather permitting, when the majority of children receiving services are in attendance. The daily routine is posted as a visual schedule in each room. The facility offers a varied supply of appropriate equipment, materials, books, and toys. A sensory area is available, with sand, water, and other materials provided in sufficient quantity to support play. Accessories are regularly provided and rotated.

General Comments

The changing area is located within a metre or less from a sink, and diaper changing procedures are posted and visible to staff completing diaper changes. Drinking water is provided throughout the day. Infant bottles are labeled and used only for the intended child. Allergy information for any child is posted and readily accessible. The infant outdoor play area is separate from other children's areas or used at different times to ensure safety and appropriate supervision.

A conversation was held with the Administrators regarding the strengths and needs of the facility. Strengths identified include the completion of developmental webs with the children, which have been expanded upon with educators. Several forms of documentation were observed throughout the facility, demonstrating thorough record-keeping and engagement.
