One preschool aged room has only one coloring book and some crayons in a bucket kept on the floor in a space that is not easily accessible to the children. The infant room has no materials available to the children to make marks on paper. All children must have daily opportunities to experience arts and sciences.

The four year old preschool room is well provisioned and organized, the educators demonstrate an understanding that the environment is the third teacher. Children were deeply engaged and as a result, are constructing deeper knowledge through sustained play.

Some educators are not documenting their planning and some are not documenting children's learning. Documentation must be visible in the childcare facility - staff must review CAT pgs 6-7 The Value of
