<b>General Comments</b>  Laundry detergent and Lysol wipes were being stored on open, unlocked, shelves. Was corrected during the inspection.
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General Comments

Transitions, for example from playtime to meal time, are challenging with long wait times and conflicts between children. QAM recommends the use of visual schedules, as well as songs, music and rhymes during transitions. This will prepare children for transitions as well as develop conventions of their language(s) and form relationships through communicative practices.

Outdoor Play Area: QAM recommends Operator remove cinder blocks and consult manufacturers' instructions for outdoor play equipment to verify that they were installed with adequate space for no-encroachment zones. Reminder that when the ground is frozen, the protective surfacing does not offer adequate cushioning to protect from falls.
