General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection took place on September 27, 2024.

Children were observed engaging in both indoor and outdoor free play.

Educators reported that the children are currently interested in the transition from summer to fall and are preparing seasonal activities. During observations, educators were seen using positive language and providing gentle reminders to the children.

Parents are granted entry to the center at any time while their children are present. Outdoor play is scheduled for at least one hour during each four-hour block of time, weather permitting. The daily routine is clearly posted in each room, and evacuation procedures are displayed in a prominent location. The room setup is inviting, with materials arranged to encourage play. Books that reflect the children's current interests are available. Traffic areas, including outdoor walkways, are kept clean and free of clutter, and drinking water is provided throughout the day.

Daily activities are purposefully planned and documented in the program, offering opportunities for both individual and group experiences. Various forms of literacy are integrated into the indoor environment,

supporting the children's literacy.

A discussion with the Administrator highlighted several strengths of the facility, including following the children's interests, such as comic strip making and Pokémon card creation, and actively involving the children in daily planning. However, some needs were also identified: all documentation should include the educator's name and date, and the latest reports, such as Follow-Ups and Monitoring reports, should be signed and posted on the parent board.
