Comments: In one room there are no art materials available on a low, open shelf. All materials must be available for children to allow for independent selection. QA Monitor discussed with the educators how they can safely offer art materials to this group, an appropriately sized small table and chairs should be added to the room so that children can choose materials and sit at a table. QA Monitor recommends that educators consult the NB Curriculum Support Document "Our Youngest Children" for more ideas on how to create an environment that reflects an image of the children as creative, capable and co-constructors of their classroom.

Comments: There is an insufficient variety and amount of play materials in the outdoor play areas. In the infant area, the infants have ride-on and push toys, but the playhouse has no accessories and there are 3 sand toys, but no shovels or buckets in the sandbox. In the larger preschool play area there was one shovel, one rake and one bucket in the sandbox. Several trucks and wagons but no additional tools to use to shovel or scoop sand. The Operator must ensure that a variety of play materials are offered in a quantity sufficient for the number of children present. The Operator must provision the outdoor play area as an extension of the indoor play environment, providing many of the same opportunities, including space for creative, quiet, pretend and sensory experiences. See Operator Manual Section 9.3.2 Outdoor play area materials and equipment and refer to the NB Curriculum Framework for additional information and examples of outdoor play areas.								
General Comments								
The QA Monitor observed that all groups of children were in the outdoor play area during the monitoring inspection. Two educators were observed kicking a soccer ball with a group of infants, gently kicking to them and encouraging the infants to kick it back. The lunch served reflects the posted menu, fish and fries with vegetables and milk.
