Comments: 2 educators hold an ECE certificate, however the College where the certificates were obtained is not listed as a Recognized Educational Institution for the Early Childhood Education Programs. Operator indicates that they verified previously to ensure that this certificate was valid, however no proof could be provided during the Renewal Inspection. Operator must provide required proof to the Inspector with regards to this.

Comments: The arrival time of 1 child was missing on the daily attendance record. This was addressed with the educator, who added the information immediately. Deficiency is now compliant			
30(3) An operator shall maintain the indoor play area of a licensed facility to ensure the safety of the children.	30(3)	Mar 15, 2024	
Comments: Inspector observed that the paint on the walls is chipped in various classrooms. Inspector also observed that the floor is broken in certain classrooms as well as in the hallway. A discussion was had with the Operator regarding this, who indicates that they are aware and will begin painting and repairing the walls and floor where needed in order to ensure that the indoor play area remains safe and clean.			
32(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall provide indoor play area materials and equipment that are (a) varied and in sufficient quantity for the number and ages of the children receiving services at the licensed facility.	32(1)(a)	Feb 20, 2024	
Comments: Inspector observed that there are only 3 books accessible to children in the Jr. Tots classroom. Administrator must ensure that a variety of books are added into the classroom.			
32(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall provide indoor play area materials and equipment that are (b) arranged on low, open shelves and accessible to the children receiving services at the licensed facility,	32(1)(b)	Feb 20, 2024	
Comments: Inspector observed that art material is not made accessible to the children in the Jr. Tots classroom. Administrator must ensure that art material is made accessible to the children.

<p>Comments: Inspector observed that 6 books are broken in the Sr. Tots classroom. Administrator must ensure that these books are repaired or removed from the classroom, in order to ensure that the material is in good repair.</p>			
<p>33(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall provide outdoor play area materials and equipment that are varied and in sufficient quantity for the number and ages of the children receiving services at the licensed facility.</p>	33(1)	Feb 06, 2024	
<p>Comments: Inspector observed that no toys were made accessible to the children while they were playing outside. A discussion was had with the Operator regarding this, who indicates that a reminder will be made in order to ensure that the outdoor play material is brought outside when the children play outdoors.</p>			
<p>33(3) An operator of a licensed facility shall complete a monthly review and maintenance plan on all stationary equipment that includes the following information: (a) the review and repair dates; (b) the action required and the action taken; and (c) the name of the staff member who conducted the review.</p>	33(3)	Feb 29, 2024	
<p>Comments: Operator indicates that the outdoor play area was verified in January 2024, however this information was not documented. Operator must ensure that this information is documented and that the outdoor play equipment is verified before February 29th 2023.</p>			
<p>39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (a) toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies;</p>	39(2)(a)	Feb 06, 2024	Feb 06, 2024
<p>Comments: Inspector found 2 bottles of shaving cream in a cabinet locked with a child safety lock in 2 different classrooms. A bottle of contact solution was also found in one of these cabinets. All toxic products must be placed under lock and key. This was done during the inspection. Deficiency is now compliant</p>			
<p>39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (b) medications.</p>	39(2)(b)	Feb 06, 2024	Feb 06, 2024
<p>Comments: A child's medication is kept in the educators bookbag. Educator was made aware that all medication must be placed under lock and key. Educator advised that the medication was placed under lock and key during the inspection. Deficiency is now compliant</p>			
<p>9(1) The child-to-staff ratio is one educator for each of the following groups of children of the same age receiving services at a full-time or part-time early learning and childcare centre: (a) three infants or fewer; (b) five children or fewer who are two years of age; (c) eight children or fewer who are three years of age; (d) ten children or fewer who are four years of age or older, but who are not yet attending school; and (e) 15 school-age children or fewer.</p>	9(1)	Feb 06, 2024	Feb 06, 2024
<p>Comments: During the rest period, Inspector observed that 1 educator was in charge of 8 resting infants. As per the Operator manual, the child-to-staff ratio for children in a group may be reduced by one-half for napping children. Therefore, 2 educators are required to be in the room. This was addressed with the Operator and Administrator and corrected. Deficiency is now compliant</p>

<p>Reminder to ensure that the dosage and the time that acetaminophen was provided to a child is indicated on the forms.</p> <p>Operator must ensure that the Detachment stamp/seal be visible on required staff's Vulnerable Sector Checks.</p> <p>The license cannot be renewed until the Inspector is provided with a new copy of the general liability coverage once it is received.</p>
