Comments: During nap time the infants under 15 months old are sleeping in the designated sleep area. The infants older than 15 months old are sleeping on cots in the classroom. During this time the two-year-old children are being combined to nap together in the infant's classroom.

Comments: During inspection all matts were leaning on each other against the wall.						

General Comments

Planned programming is evident in the facility. When licensing staff arrived the two-year-old children were busy with a sensory bin of oatmeal, dump trucks, bulldozers, cars and shamrocks.

The operator has been making improvements to the center. New flooring has been installed in the three year old class room, and repairs to the walls have started as the operator plans to paint the interior in the future. More natural items are also being added to the classrooms.

The infants have not been going outside. As per the Operators Manual Section 7.2 Daily Routine: The daily routine of a licensed facility shall include: (a) outdoor play for at least one hour in each four-hour block of time when majority of children receiving services are in attendance. Outdoor play is important to a child's healthy development.

Also noted during the inspection, the nap cots were not stored separately as they found in the storage area, leaning on each other against the wall.

The educators were friendly and actively involved with the children during the inspection.

As per section 9.2.3 Rest Area:

36(7) A nap mat shall be at least 5cm in thickness and stored in a way that avoids contact with the surface of another nap mat or disinfected on both sided after each use.

During the inspection it was noticed that the two-year old children were being combined with the infants during naptime. This process is not permitted due to regulation 8.1.3 Child-Staff -Ratio, Section 10(7) Despite subsection (1) infants shall not be grouped with children of another age group. Due to this regulation the twoyear -old group will need to start napping in their own classroom.
