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General Comments
Upon licensing staff's arrival for the renewal inspection, the children had just finished eating snack and were engaged in free play. The environment is set up in a loft-style layout, with a dramatic play area offering access to a variety of accessories and materials. Other areas included a craft area, music bins, LEGO, puzzles, a library, blocks, and other age-appropriate materials. The operator was observed actively playing and engaging with the children in the dramatic play area. Evidence of curriculum implementation and documentation was displayed throughout the environment. The older preschool child was observed talking about a story and music, and the operator engaged the child in meaningful conversations. One child dressed in a firefighter costume and used a homemade "fire hose" made from recycled materials while engaging in imaginative play and pretending to put out a fire. The group then transitioned outdoors. The operator guided the children through the transition while encouraging and promoting independence as they prepared to go outside. The outdoor environment is spacious and offers a variety of areas and materials to support play and learning. These included music and sensory walls, construction areas with recycled pipes, blocks and hard hats, swings, a craft area, tires, and various climbing opportunities. The operator provided active supervision and redirection as needed while supporting the children's play. When it was time for lunch, the group transitioned back indoors. The children washed their hands and ate lunches brought from home. Only positive child guidance practices were observed throughout the visit. Fire drills are completed monthly. Licensing staff recommends the program for renewal.
