General Comments

Children were observed in both the indoor and outdoor play environments.

The outdoor play environment offers many spots for climbing, balancing, and running. There are pieces of wood for building at the back. Some buckets and pails were in the back in the sandbox.

Some recommendations for the outdoor play space are:

recommendations.

- 1. Set the sandbox materials up closer to the mud kitchen at the front. Since the sand is becoming hard due to the colder weather, the children enjoyed scooping with the wood chips but only two shovels could be found. Adding additional shovels and small containers would allow for more children to play.
- 2. Some children removed their mitts when it was not as cold, so books, clipboards, and crayons could also be brought out to add to the 4 picnic tables that are available.
- 3. The ball ramp could have a bucket of different sized balls beside it to encourage the children to use it.
- 4. The wooden scale at the back could have containers attached so children could use this equipment.
- 5. There is a large chalkboard at the top of the gravel mound. Chalk could be provided to children for mark-making.
- 6. Additional indoor materials can be added as needed and that are of interest to the children: large play animals or dolls.

Page 169 of the Operator's Manual has a list of suggested outdoor play materials and equipment that is part of Appendix 24. Despite it being a list that is for School-Aged children, it has great suggestions that could be added to your space and easily accessible for children. Examples are: small wagons, skipping ropes, and hula
