<p>General Comments</p> <p>On the day of my monitoring visit the program opened inside due to the rainy weather. Normally the Junior Kindergarten program begins outside and moves inside later for snack, free play, circle time, and invitations for play. Upon arrival the children were playing with a variety of toys and different areas were set up with invitations for interesting and interactive play. There is an area for reading and for calming sensory overload with books, cushions, and fidget toys. A rug area for setting up blocks and building things, a table with art activities, today concerning butterflies. The educators mentioned that they had just watched the life cycle of the butterfly and that they are going to be joining the kindergarten program to watch the live chrysalids transform into butterflies when they arrive. The children were reading a great series about butterflies as well, <i>The Little Butterfly That Could</i> by Ross Burrach. There was a table to make butterflies and there were stickers, paper, glue, scissors, markers, coloured pencils and coloured paper to enrich the activity and to give the children more choices in how this craft activity is done. There were beads and pipe cleaners, a paint activity with coloured water and sensory bins containing pom poms, black sunflower seeds and instruments for scooping, just to name a few examples. The entire cozy/calming corner was created with the inclusion and diversity grant.</p> <p>The classroom was well organized and there were many examples of the children's learning. The educators share stories and photos of the children's day with the parents through a closed app, called class dojo. The educators were very engaged in the children's play and interested in their stories and ideas. There were many great conversations taking place and all child guidance techniques were kind and patient.</p> <p>Seven child files were reviewed and found to be complete. The attendance files, first aid kits and staff files were also reviewed and up to date. The center is clean and the room was bright and inviting. The children are preparing for their graduation celebration on June 5th and practicing their songs for this event.</p>
