Comments: During the Monitoring Inspection, it was determined that groups are combining at the end of the day and in the morning to accommodate staffing. One educator is supervising the children within two groups. As per the COVID-19 Guidance document, educators are to stay with the same group of children throughout the day, including at the beginning or ending of the day. Facilities cannot reconfigure groups when attendance may be lower. Discussed with operator - plan to be put in place to ensure this requirement is met. Group Logs do not reflect all children within each group. All children must be included on Group Log each day. Date established not changed when new child enrolled. Discussed with educators today.

Comments: Preschool Room (both sides):

Tops of shelving, tables and cabinets - cluttered and unorganized. Indoor play area to be free of clutter.

Excess materials to be removed.

Window ledge accumulating dust and debris. To be cleaned, this area is considered a high touch surface and

must be cleaned at least twice daily.

Preschool room (group at back):

Art shelf cluttered and unorganized. To be organized and clutter removed.

Preschool room (group at front):

Paw Patrol Tower accumulating dust and debris. To be cleaned.

Storage bins for dolls, animals and other materials unorganized. To be organized and excess materials

removed.

General Comments

Monitoring Inspection:

Infant Room:

Infants observed exploring art with their educator this morning. Educator observed encouraging the children to try new experiences during their exploration of the art materials.

Photos of the children are posted on the wall and the educator adds bubbles with the new words the infants have begun to say. This is great way to document the children's learning over time.

Twos Room:

The educator in this room had responded to the children's interest in firefighters by giving them the opportunity to use spray water bottles to put out "fires". The children were squirting the toys, windows and pretend flames that the educator had laminated and posted on the wall. The educator has also added a firefighter costume and a firetruck to the learning environment.

Outdoors the children were observed exploring chunks of ice with their educator. The educator was observed bringing more ice into the play area to expand on the interest of the children in that moment.

Preschool Room (group in back):

Children in this group were engaged in outdoor play this morning. Children were enjoying playing in the mud with their peers.

Discussed with educators creating an inviting art area with shared bins of mark making materials, as they currently have individual pencil cases. Shared art materials allows for more variety and free choice opportunities. Ensure art materials that can be cleaned are included in the daily cleaning and disinfection routine.

Preschool Room (group in front):

The children and educator in this group were observed engaging in meaningful conversations during story time and during the transition to outside play. The group was going outside to "hunt for signs of Spring".

During outdoor play children were given opportunities to explore healthy risks while playing in a wooded area with a variety of large loose parts.

General Comments
All children appear to be happy and comfortable in their environment. It is evident that the educators respond to and support the children's interests and learning.
Discussed removing nap mats from preschool play area and storing them in the storage room.
Next steps: Removing clutter from shelving; utilizing the tops of shelves to display materials and books rather then accumulating clutter will create a more inviting environment. Displaying books throughout the interest centres to support the children's interests. Adding/updating labels on bins.
