Room 5- Family wall and webs of individual children a great way to create a sense of belonging and valuing relationships. Displays of materials very inviting. Love the Big Ant!!

Room 6- Educators observed to be very engaged in activities with the children. Current topic of interest evident in materials throughout the environment.

New shelving in all rooms are a great addition and look great!

Ensure attendance record go with each room when they leave the building for walks or in the outdoor play area. (page 39 of the operator manual).

Ensure all pages of inspection reports are visible on parent board.

Recommendation: More sand needed in for sandboxes in outdoor play areas.
