General Comments

A renewal inspection occurred today. Children were observed during morning snack, inside free play, preparing and going for a walk, outside play, lunch, nap/quiet time, and afternoon snack. Diaper changing and handwashing routines were also observed. All staff files were reviewed. A random review of children's files occurred and verified complete. Discussed loose parts and facility to ensure that small parts that would create a choking hazard are not accessible to the children. These can be used but only under direct supervision. Discussed nap times. Rest time that meets the needs of each infant and preschool child receiving services at the licensed facility but that does not exceed two consecutive hours unless there is a written request from a child's parent or guardian to extend the length of time. Discussed having this in the child(ren's) files for those parents who wish for the children to sleep longer than two hours. In each of the learning environments on this license, the children's learning is documented and displayed using varying forms of documentation. Educators were observed down at the level of the children engaged in their learning, play and tending to their needs appropriately.
