| Comments: During the monitoring inspection visit, licensing staff noted that the indoor play space, in the school-aged classroom, was cluttered with chairs, high chairs, booster seats, cots, mats and other play materials. | Comments: While licensing staff was conducting a monitoring inspection visit, it was noted that a wooden playhouse, located on the school-aged program playground, had protruding nails and staples on boards that were once covered by another board but that board is now missing and therefore the protruding nails and staples were exposed. Please ensure that the protruding nails and staples are either removed or hammered down and then covered by a board in order to maintain the safety of the school-aged children receiving services at the licensed facility. |  |           |                           |                     |         |                  |                  |  |
| It was also noted that white pressed boards, with protruding nails, were being stored against the building where the school-aged children play. ## **General Comments**

Licensing staff arrived at the licensed facility to conduct a monitoring inspection visit on October 5th, 2022.

When licensing staff arrived at the centre, a majority of the children were napping and engaging in quiet time activities. When licensing staff arrived, a movie was playing for the children. Licensing staff asked the operator if playing a movie during quiet time happens on a daily basis? The operator relayed to licensing staff that movies are not played every day and that they alternate quiet time activities. Some times the children are offered other quiet time activities such as books, colouring etc. According to the Operator Manual, on page 54, it states that television viewing is limited and is not used daily; and should not be used to fill in a gap in the day. Please ensure that television viewing is limited and if the children would rather play with other materials, the children are permitted to do so.

During the inspection visit, after nap/quiet time, the children were observed smiling and engaging in a variety of activities. The educators were observed positively guiding children. when required. For example, when a child stood up from the table with scissors in hand, an educator asked the child if it was safe to walk around with scissors in his hand? The child realized that it wasn't safe and went back to sit down at the table.

Licensing staff observed an abundance documented learning posted on the walls of the facility, in each classroom.

An educator was also observed snuggling with a child when they woke up from their nap.
