General Comments

Some children were still napping when licensing staff arrived. Children in the preschool group were awake and gathered around a table watching an iPad. A reminder that television viewing can support curriculum in a multimodal environment but is not recommended to fill gaps in the day such as quiet time. Children were waking up from naps shortly after one and the operator turned the lights back on at 1:20. Children got ready to go outside washing their hands and using the washroom. Younger children that remained inside were provided time to completely wake up and have snack then engage in play in the room before going outside. The educator was down on the floor with children helping with aprons and talking about their play in the new play kitchen.

In discussion with educators about documentation, they were able to show multiple learning stories that were created for portfolios and parents. Licensing staff reminded educators to post learning stories within the environment along with other forms of documentation such as children's names, photos, quotes, webbing, and community connections. Children's birthdays were posted on the wall, and one room was working on a family wall which licensing staff suggested adding print. Educators presented some photos on their phones and shared experiences about the children's learning and how they are reflecting on children's interests and strengths. Licensing staff also suggested ideas for invitations building on the children's interest in the kitchen by adding recipes and materials. In the outdoor environment, documentation can be posted on the fence so children can extend their outdoor play. The environment had many new resources added to support children's learning.
