### General Comments

Upon licensing staff arrival for the annual renewal inspection, school-age children were observed concluding their afternoon quiet time session. Children put away their books and quiet toys before transitioning to a group game of bingo. During the activity, one child displayed strong emotions related to losing a round. The educator responded by validating the child's feelings and reassuring him that they may have another opportunity to win in a future round, positively encouraging them. Children who chose not to participate in bingo were observed engaging in drawing activities at the table.

After several rounds of bingo, the group prepared for a scheduled swim within the Ayr Motor Centre. Educators organized the transition by sending children in small groups to change into their bathing suits. Once all children were changed, the group lined up and moved together to the pool area, where lifeguards were present.

The indoor environment contained a variety of age-appropriate toys and materials, including dolls, a play kitchen, board games, chess, toy cars, animals, and a craft station. Children's artwork was displayed throughout the space. A designated "Pokémon station" was also noted, where children had set up an area for exchanging playing cards.

Child and staff files were reviewed and verified. Positive child guidance strategies were consistently observed throughout the visit.

Licensing staff recommend for renewal.
